JEREMY CHAPMAN



Professor Jeremy Chapman is a renal physician with a special interest in transplantation. He is Director of Renal Medicine at Westmead Hospital, Consultant to the NSW Australian Red Cross Blood Service Tissue Typing Laboratory and Chairman of the Australian Bone Marrow Donor Registry, the Australian Cord Blood Bank Network. He is a Clinical Professor at the University of Sydney. He is Past-President of The Transplantation Society and Transplantation Society of Australia and New Zealand, Advisory Member of WHO Expert Advisory Panel on Human Cell Tissue and Organ Transplantation and Co-Chair of the Declaration of Istanbul Custodian Group. He received the Asturias Foundation Award for International Cooperation on behalf of TTS and David Hume Award of the US National Kidney Foundation in 2010. Professor Chapman's clinical work is in renal medicine, transplantation of kidney and pancreas and diabetic renal disease and islet transplantation. He is currently pursuing research interests in transplantation, tissue typing and xenotransplantation. He has recently been appointed Editor-in-Chief of the prestigious Journal 'Transplantation'.

JAN SWINNEN



Dr John Swinnen is the staff specialist and vascular surgeon at Westmead Hospital, Sydney. He also worked as general surgeon in the hospitals of UK and New Zealand from 1982 to 1999. His interests include vascular ultrasound, hemodialysis access and endovascular intervention where he performs the procedures in Cath lab in cardiology, angio-radiology and interventional neuro-radiology suites. He runs the Western Sydney Carotid Stenting Program and has presented widely his fistula work in the form of live workshops all over Australia and South East Asia. He has organized over 20 workshops nationally and internationally on haemodialysis access, vascular access, fistula cathlab and vascular interventions. He has published a number of original research articles on various aspects of hemodialysis access in internationally indexed journals.

GERMAINE WONG



Germaine Wong, Associate Professor is an academic transplant nephrologist at Westmead Hospital, in Sydney. She is also a Principal Research Fellow at the University of Sydney. She has established, led and co-ordinated a number of large scale population-based observational studies that assessed the impact of social determinants and outcomes in people with chronic kidney disease and kidney transplants. Using big data, Germaine has provided novel based evidence on the health determinants and outcomes associated with chronic kidney disease. She has developed a world-class team of research excellence that focuses largely on improving the health outcomes of transplantation, integrating transplant epidemiology with biostatistics, bioinformatics, health economics, health services and implementation research that aims to provide a comprehensive evidentiary base for preventive, monitoring and treatment strategies to reduce the burden of co-morbidities after transplantation. She has published over 120 peer-reviewed publications since 2009.

Deborah Knagge is a dedicated and caring health care worker with 35 years' experience in the Nursing profession specialising in the field of Nephrology including haemodialysis, paediatrics, transplantation, peritoneal, acute and satellite dialysis. She got her BSN from Sydney University and specialized in Renal Nursing from NSW College of Nursing and Liverpool Hospital. Debbie has had a long and active role with the Renal Society of Australia, holding the positions of NSW President for four years. She has presented at a number of conferences and participated in organising committees as well as facilitating the access workshop for NSW Renal Nurses. She is currently employed as Renal Access Coordinator at Royal North Shore Hospital in Sydney. Debbie is proactive in advancing her professional development, attending state and national conferences in addition to regular attendance in international events. She enjoys passing on skills and knowledge through workshops and mentoring colleagues whenever possible.
