She is Chief Research Officer and Deputy Director Research and Training at KEMR, an Associate Research Professor at the University of Washington (Departments of Obstetrics and Gynecology and Global health), an honorary lecturer at Aga Khan University in Nairobi and Volunteer Clinical Faculty – Professor at the University of California San Francisco (Department of Obstetrics, Gynecology & Reproductive Sciences). Her primary areas of interest in research focus on sexually transmitted infections, reproductive health, and HIV prevention, care and treatment. She is a member of the Kenya National AIDS Control Council HIV Prevention Task force and has been appointed to serve as a member of the Board of Management of the Medical Research Council (South Africa).
