Biosketch

Paul A. Lombardo is a Regents Professor and Professor of Law at Georgia State University College of Law, where he teaches courses in Genetics and the Law, the History of Bioethics, Mental Health Law and the Legal Regulation of Human Research at the Center for Law, Health and Society. He has published extensively on topics in health law, medico-legal history, and bioethics. He is coeditor of *Fletcher's Clinical Ethics*, (3rd ed.) and author of *Three Generations, No Imbeciles: Eugenics, the Supreme Court and Buck v. Bell* (Johns Hopkins University Press, 2008), and *A Century of Eugenics in America* (Indiana University Press, 2011).

From 2011-2016 he was a Senior Advisor to the Presidential Commission for the Study of Bioethical Issues. From 1990 until 2006 Dr. Lombardo served on the faculty of the Schools of Law and Medicine at the University of Virginia, where he was the Director of the Center for Mental Health Law at the Institute of Law, Psychiatry and Public Policy, then the Director of the Program in Law and Medicine at the Center for Biomedical Ethics. From 1985-1990 he practiced law in California.

Dr. Lombardo holds a B.A. from Rockhurst College, an M.A. from Loyola University in Chicago, Illinois, and both the Ph.D. and J.D. degrees from the University of Virginia.

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
