

## SIUT Hosts Global Robotic Surgery Symposium

**S**IUT stands as a beacon of medical excellence known for its expertise in urology, nephrology, organ transplant, and hepatobiliary care. In its relentless pursuit of innovation, SIUT has advanced its surgical capabilities by incorporating robotic-assisted surgery, marking a significant leap in precision and minimally invasive procedures. Initiated in 2017, SIUT began its robotic surgery program by utilizing a shared Da Vinci robotic surgical system at Civil Hospital Karachi, successfully performing more than 600 procedures.

In November 2021, SIUT established the Kassim Parekh Robotic and Laparoscopy Unit, featuring the advanced, state-of-the-art Versius robotic surgical system. Since its implementation, over 2500 surgeries have been successfully conducted, revolutionizing surgical precision in urological, hepatobiliary, and colorectal surgery. In October 2022, SIUT expanded its robotic surgery services to Sukkur by establishing a Center of Excellence in Robotic Surgery at the SIUT Chablani Medical Centre.

The two-day Global Robotic Surgery Symposium highlights SIUT's commitment to expand Robotic Surgery all over Pakistan. Symposium was held on February 14-15, 2025. This was a joint meeting of the International Society of Robotic Surgery (SRS) and the Pakistan Society of Robotic Surgeons (PSRS).

The inaugural sessions included a welcome address by Prof. Adib Rizvi and speeches by Prof. Saeed Qureshy, President of PSRS, and Prof. Ghulam Abbas, President of SRS. The session was moderated by Dr. Irfan Rizvi, Chairman Dept. of Surgery Virginia Hospital Center Washington.

The symposium also included a hands-on workshop on the general introduction of robotic simulation and individual practice of 2-3 basic exercises on Virtual Reality (VR).

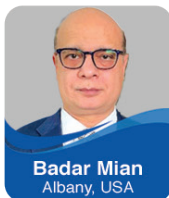
The two-day symposium had 6 sessions focusing on various aspects of robotic surgery. It brought together surgeons and medical specialists from across the

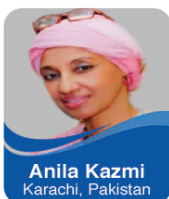

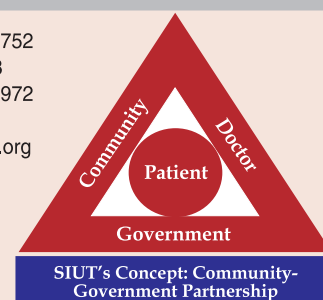

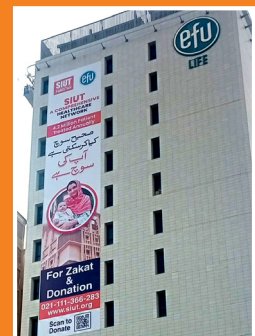

Jafarey took the audience on a visual journey, reflecting on CBEC's progress through the past two decades.

Dr. Ceasar Atuire, President of the International Association of Bioethics, served as the keynote speaker on

Zoom. He explored the concept of pluriversality and critiqued the colonial mindset within bioethical traditions and highlighted the importance of local context and values in shaping human morality.

The first day included presentations by CBEC's alumni, Dr. Amjad Mahboob (KPK), Dr. Nida Wahid Bashir (Sindh), and Dr. Natasha Anwar (Punjab) who described the impact their ethics education in the Centre has had on their personal and professional lives. The afternoon sessions focused on "Women in Pakistan" with engaging talks by Dr. Arfana Mallah and Dr. Fatima Hasan. The day concluded with an engaging theatrical performance by schoolchildren that spotlighted environmental concerns, adding a creative dimension to the conference's ethical discourse.

The talks on the second day included Dr. Paul Lombardo, a historian and bioethicist from the USA, on the Muslim philosopher and physician, Ibn-e-Sina. Dr. Syed Noman-ul-Haq of IBA discussed the story of Hayy ibn Yaqzān by Muslim philosopher, Ibn-Tufayl. Dr. Nauman Faizi from the School of Social Sciences and Humanities, LUMS critiqued the dominant bioethical approaches and spoke about the ways to deal with the 'wicked problem' of uncertainty.

The conference concluded with an Urdu literary session exploring the relationship between literature and human values. The panel featured celebrated poets Iftikhar Arif Sahib and Zehra Nigah Sahiba, moderated by renowned poet and writer Harris Khalique. This culturally rich session served as a fitting end to a conference centered on diverse dimensions of morality.

Overall, the conference proved to be a huge success and drew professionals and the public alike. It was also heartening to see several Karachi-based CBEC alumni attending the conference. ■

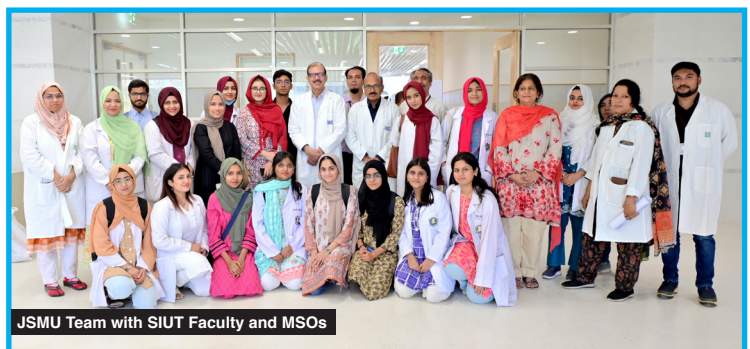

## Dr. Syed Haroon Ahmed, a legend, is no more

Syed Haroon Ahmed, one of the country's leading psychiatrists and a prominent civil and human rights activist, passed away in Karachi on 3rd April 2025. He was 92.

Dr Haroon's overriding ability and unflinching faith in the betterment of the masses, including his patients, gave him a special place in society, not only as a physician but also as a teacher and a mentor.

Born in Jaunpur, Uttar Pradesh, his family migrated to Pakistan after Partition, where he commenced his professional and political journey from the Dow Medical College.

At the time, the institution was considered a bastion of student activists with a progressive mindset, who dreamed of establishing an egalitarian society based on justice, equality and democratic values.

The young Haroon was one of the founding leaders of the Democratic Students Federation (DSF), which carried this message.

Many medical students remained part of this struggle, including the likes of Dr Mohammad Sarwar and Dr Mir Rehman Ali Hashmi.

Dr Haroon remained committed to the cause of human rights, minority rights and secularism all his life.

He joined the Jinnah Hospital before it was called Jinnah Post Graduate Medical Centre and accomplished a milestone when he succeeded in establishing a separate wing in the hospital and introduced psychiatry as an independent clinical subject.

Forceful, yet soft-spoken, Dr Haroon advocated the need for an extensive medical network in the field of mental health.

'As a senior psychiatrist at Jinnah Hospital's Ward 20, he contributed significantly to the development of psychiatric care [in the country]. He cofounded the Pakistan Psychiatric Society in 1972 and, earlier in 1965, established the Pakistan Association for Mental Health (PAMH).

Beyond his contributions to mental health, he was a fervent advocate for peace and human rights. As president of the International Physicians for the Prevention of Nuclear War, he was one of the few courageous voices to campaign against Pakistan's nuclear armament in 1998.

Dr Haroon's dedication to human rights was further reflected in his longstanding association with the Human Rights Commission of Pakistan (HRCP).

'Recognising the outdated nature of Pakistan's psychiatric legislation, he spearheaded efforts to replace the archaic Lunacy Act 1912.

'His perseverance led to the passage of the Sindh Mental Health Act of 2013, the first law in Pakistan to provide safeguards for individuals with psychiatric illnesses, including those accused under blasphemy laws. His relentless advocacy ensured its enactment, leaving an indelible mark on the country's legal framework,' the PAMH president said.

He was also one of the founding trustees of the Sindh Institute of Urology and Transplant (SIUT).

Dr Haroon is survived by his wife Anis Haroon a known political figure and social activist as well as two sons and a daughter. A large number of people from the medical fraternity and defenders of human rights, social justice, and freedom of expression also mourn him. ■
