

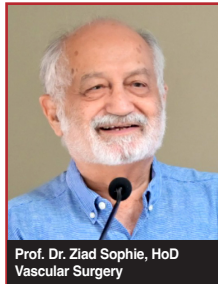
2nd PAKVESCON Conference at SIUT

The Vascular Surgery Department at Sindh Institute of Urology and Transplantation (SIUT) hosted the second annual Pakistan Vascular and Endovascular Conference (PAK VESCON) on 18th-20th September 2025, bringing together national and international vascular surgeons on the forum of "Education and training in Vascular Surgery".

In memory of Sultan Zafar

SIUT honours the courage of Dr. Mehr Afroz on World Organ Donation Day on August 13, 2025, and her family, and we deeply admire her unwavering strength in the face of profound grief and sorrow when she decided to donate her son's Sultan Zafar organs to save the lives of two people. His kidneys were transplanted in SIUT, giving a new life to a 42-year-old doctor and a 19-year-old girl.

Sultan, aged 23, a young medical student, was on the path to serve and heal. After a tragic accident claimed his life, his journey did not end. In a moment of overwhelming grief, Dr. Mehr made a deeply selfless decision. With immense strength, she consented to donate her son's organs so that others may live.

May his legacy continue to inspire acts of kindness and healing.

The gathering, held on World Organ Donation Day, was a heartfelt tribute to both Sultan's compassionate spirit and his mother's extraordinary bravery.

The hall then rose in silence as Dr. Mehr Afroz took the stage to honor the memory of her beloved son, Sultan Zafar. She shared his

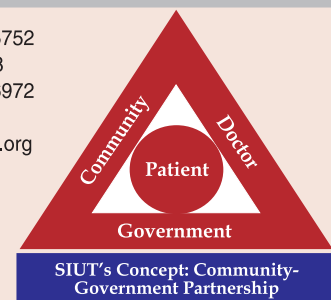

Memoriam for Dr. Ali Jumshyd

A condolence meeting was held in SIUT for Dr. Ali Jumshyd on 15th September 2025.

Dr. Anis-ul-Hassan of the Radiology Department a close associate and student of Dr. Jumshyd highlighted his life's journey, which was remarkable, inspirational, and deeply impactful.

Graduated from Dow Medical College Karachi in 1961, Dr. Jumshyd pursued radiology with passion and excellence. In the UK, he earned both DMRT and DMRD, becoming the only radiologist of his time in Pakistan trained in both diagnostic radiology and radiotherapy. He went on to achieve FRCR in England and later became board-certified in the US.

Dr. Adib Rizvi convinced him to return to Pakistan to serve his country.

He established the National X-Ray and Ultrasound Center and helped lay the foundation for what is today one

of the largest radiology departments in Pakistan at SIUT, where, in 2024 alone, nearly 700,000 patients received diagnostic tests. He also contributed to Aga Khan University, trained generations of radiologists, and played a key role in establishing FCPS examinations in radiology.

In 1996, he moved to the US, continuing his career at the Houston VA Medical Center until

retirement. Even then, he remained committed to service, helping establish SIUT North America and raising vital funds to support patients back home.

In every role – radiologist, teacher, leader, mentor – he carried himself with humility, warmth, and unwavering integrity.

Dr. Jumshyd leaves behind not only a remarkable legacy of achievement but a community of people whose lives were better because he was in them. ■

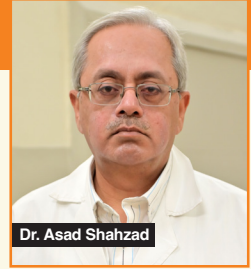
Celebrates in Research Laboratory

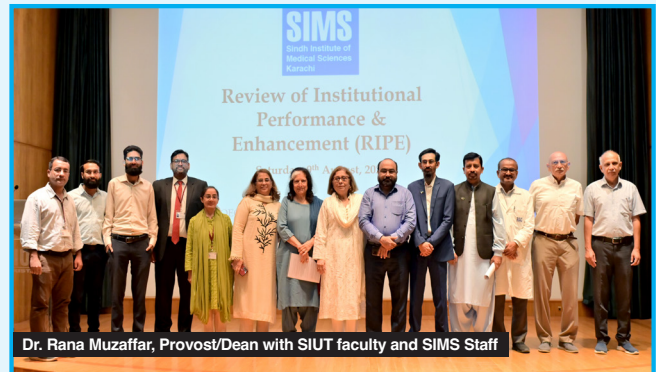

The Division of Cardiothoracic Sciences, SIUT, organized a landmark three-day 4D Echocardiography Workshop from 11–13 September 2025, led by Dr. Mohamed Abdelaal (Kuwait) and Ms. Dalia Hilal (Dubai), with coordination by Dr. Shazia Mohsin.

The first two days were dedicated to hands-on 4D echocardiography on pediatric cases at SIUT, utilizing the latest high-end ultrasound systems and advanced imaging software available in the Non-Invasive Imaging Unit. On the third day, a national course on 4D imaging was conducted, attended by imaging specialists and cardiologists from AKUH, Tabba Heart Institute, AFIC, Tayaba Institute of Cardiology, Peshawar Institute of Cardiology, and Children's Hospital Lahore.

This was a first-of-its-kind initiative in Pakistan, marking SIUT's Cardiothoracic Division as a pioneer in pediatric 4D echocardiography and collaborative learning in advanced imaging. ■

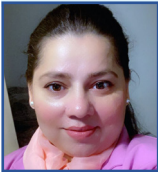

Dr. Sidra Khan, HoD Pharmacy Services. SIUT welcomed the guests and the invited speakers.



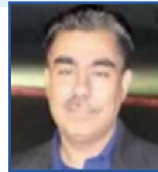

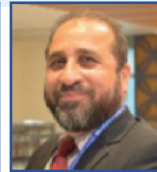

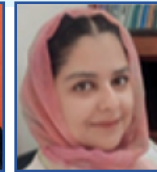
