

Healthcare Centre at Kathore



A 'Primary Healthcare Centre' has been established by SIUT at its Institute of Biotechnology & Transplant Sciences at Education City Kathore, which was inaugurated by the Chief Minister of Sindh Syed Qaim Ali Shah.

Kathore - some 25 kilometers from the heart of Karachi is a village representing rural population of great metropolis comprising more than 3 hundred villages with an estimated population of over a million. The village lacks the basic amenities of life particularly in the field of health delivery sector.

In his welcome address at the inauguration ceremony, Prof. Adibul Hasan Rizvi said that SIUT has always maintained that primary healthcare is a vital component of overall healthcare system. Always responding to the health needs of the disenfranchised segment of the population and providing them 'Free treatment and beyond' SIUT has created another milestone in this direction by setting a "Primary Healthcare Centre in Kathore". In this centre diseases like malaria, diarrhea, tuberculosis, febrile illnesses, stone related diseases, diabetes, and hypertension to name a few are being treated.

Prof. Rizvi said that ever since its inception some four decades ago, SIUT has always maintained an unflinching philosophy that medical care is the birth right of every individual and they should get the medical facilities without discrimination on the basis of cast, color, creed, gender or ethnicity. SIUT has in the past, created many landmarks proving that desired goals can be achieved through public and government partnership and self reliant basis, without any outside borrowing.

On this occasion the chief minister of Sindh Syed Qaim Ali Shah said services provided by SIUT in its specialized medical fields under the leadership of Prof Adib Rizvi are simply unparallel. Sheer dedication and commitment to mitigate the suffering of the people has been the hallmark of SIUT and setting up of a primary healthcare centre at Kathore is another landmark to their credit. The most redeeming part of SIUT's activities is that they have always come forward and responded to the needs of society and filled the gap if arising in the medical delivery system. The decision to set up a unit in Sukkur and some other parts of Karachi is a reminder that SIUT medical professionals were fully aware of the needs of the society and committed to extend their activities at the door steps of the people.

Futuristic plans of SIUT are also praiseworthy as they have acquired a piece of 100 acres of land in Kathore to set up a full fledged institute for transplant sciences and biotechnology. It was very prudent on the part of SIUT to proceed ahead and establish a primary healthcare unit till the time the arrangements for the proposed institute are finalized and government is able to pay the seed money for setting up the institute ■



# Workshop on Hepatopancreatic Biliary (HPB) Surgery



"To commemorate College of Physician & Surgeons Pakistan (CPSP)'s Golden Jubilee celebrations, a series of preconference workshops were organized in major cities of Pakistan. The workshop on HPB surgery was organized by the Gastro Intestinal & Hepato Pancreatic Biliary Surgery department, SIUT. The workshop was inaugurated by the President of CPSP, Mr. Zafarullah Choudhary who elucidated on the role of CPSP in postgraduate education in Pakistan since its inception in 1962. He lauded the services of SIUT in not only providing quality care to patients but also in imparting much needed post-graduate education and training.

The course objectives included learning the diagnostic radiology of space occupying lesions of the liver and principles of liver resection (with live demonstration of a case). The session also demonstrated the maneuvers of performing a safer laparoscopic cholecystectomy, and highlighted the pitfalls leading to biliary injuries. Endoscopic management of these injuries was highlighted by Dr Nasir Luck (SIUT) and surgical management by Dr Arsalan Khan (SIUT). In relation to the pancreas, management of pancreatic abscesses and other collections in relations to severe pancreatitis was also discussed.

The conference was well attended with more than 70 participants from outside SIUT including Quetta. The panel of experts included Prof. Mumtaz Mehr, Prof. Irfan Daudi, Dr Rizwan Khan, Dr Hasnain Zafar and Dr Abid Jamal. The workshop facilitator was Prof. Dr Abdaal Wasim (SIUT) ■


According to an estimate, some 18,000 people die every year in the country as an end case of renal failure and lack of dialysis facility.






Athletes taking part in the event were those who had either received or donated life saving organs. SIUT's sponsored contingent also included similar patients who had gone through transplant procedures at SIUT and now leading a normal and a healthy life. SIUT'S vision of participation was that "staging sports and social events for transplant patients is in fact a demonstration of benefits of organ donation which also proves that both recipients and donors can lead a normal and healthy life". SIUT has been regularly sending its transplanted patients to various international events in the past as well.


SIUT's athletes achieved a remarkable success by bagging six medals including one gold, three silver and two bronze. Over hundred and fifty transplant athletes representing eleven Middle Eastern regions took part in the four day event. SIUT transplant athletes who claimed medals in the competition included Mr. Sufyan Arshad who outclassed his opponents in 100 meters swimming competition and secured the gold by coming first. In another category of swimming Salman Akhtar captured second position in breast stroke and walked away with a silver. In field and tracks event, Mr. Arshad Minhas and Salman Akhtar jointly bagged silver medals in two kilometer race. Mr. Hasan Zaman another transplanted patient claimed bronze in 100 meters. Mr. Rashid Kamal who took part in 200 meters won the bronze.


