ospital acquired infections have become a major cause of morbidity and mortality. HAI surveillance is now an integral part of quality of care in hospitals. It is a systematic collection, analysis and interpretation of infections in the hospital. HAIs contribute to poor patient outcomes and additional costs to the healthcare systems. The goal of HAI surveillance is to provide information that can be used by the hospital administration and healthcare providers for making effective policies and changes to the system.





A seminar on HAI surveillance and workshop on Infection Control was held at SIUT in July 2019. The Seminar was conducted by Dr. Nizam Damani who is a Clinical Director of Infection Prevention and Control at the Southern Health and Social Services Trust in Northern Ireland and Senior Lecturer in Medical Microbiology at Queens University Belfast and Dr. Muhammad Sartaj who is a consultant at Health Protection in Public Health Agency of Northern Ireland, UK.

World Hepatitis Day at SIUT

World Health Organization (WHO) reports that globally viral hepatitis B and C affects 325 million people and causes 1.4 million deaths annually. About 80% of the people infected by these viruses do not have access to testing or treatment facilities. In Pakistan around 7.4% of the population is suffering from chronic hepatitis B and C, the highest in South East Asia region. A day long awareness program was held at SIUT in July where public was informed about the mode of disease transmission, treatment and methods to prevent various forms of Hepatitis. These preventive methods included use of boiled water for drinking, practice of hand washing before eating and after using washrooms, changing diapers, use of new syringes, razor blades and use of sterilized dental and surgical equipment in case of any procedure.

People attending the awareness program were screened for Hepatitis B and C, liver function tests, ultrasound of abdomen along with vaccination for Hepatitis B. Awareness and treatment lectures were given by Dr. Manzoor Siddiqui, Dr. Farina Hanif, Dr. Abbas Ali Tasneem, Dr. Shoaib, Dr. Mudassir Laeeq, Dr. Ghaus Soomro, Dr. Nasir Luck, along with dietician Ms. Kehkashan Zehra. More than 600 people attended the day long program from all walks of life to avail the free testing facilities for Hepatitis

The PAP – Karachi Chapter held in July a half day workshop at Javed I. Kazi Department of Histopathology, SIUT. This was first of a series of planned CME workshops under the aegis of PAP – Karachi at SIUT.

The workshop included both lectures and interactive case



discussions. Dr. Mubarak's talk focused on non-proliferative disorders of the glomeruli and was followed by interesting renal biopsy case discussions. Case histories were described by Dr. Shaheera Shakeel. A total 28 interesting cases were discussed encompassing the wide spectrum of native renal pathologies. The lecture by Dr. Ali was on Carbapenem resistant pathogens with
